

The main points of interest along this route are the lagoons, the Covão do Redondo dam and the town of Carregueira.

A difficult route that takes cyclists down country lanes, across Carrequeira and southwards, through the valleys and hills of the Ribatejo. The landscape is dominated by cork daks and eucalyptus trees.
